Frank O. Gehry's Guggenheim Museum, an architectural masterpiece, attracts nearly one million (1) a year to Bilbao, Spain. Other cities have tried to engineer a similar "Bilbao effect."

For the Basque Country Administration (the owners), this museum of contemporary art is part of a vast (2) revitalization plan. For the Solomon R. Guggenheim Foundation, which co-manages the museum and provides artworks, the Bilbao museum is part (3) a plan to "franchise" the Guggenheim experience outside of New York.

The collage-like architecture has several sources of inspiration. Frank Lloyd Wright's celebrated Guggenheim in New York.
